Reporting Period: 01 April 2022 through 30 April 2022

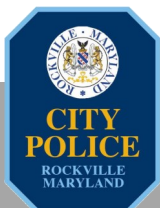
Part 1 offense reports

In April 2022 and within the boundaries of Twinbrook Community Association (TCA), Rockville City (RCPD) and Montgomery County police (MCPD) together recorded three (3) reports of Part 1 offenses, to include:

- ⇒ Two (2) reports of theft-from-auto:
 - ⇒ First on the 300 block of Dean Drive, a resident left her vehicle unlocked on April 29 at 5:00 p.m. and returned the next day to find \$50 cash stolen
 - ⇒ Then, 0.33 miles west-southwest, a resident on the 1200 block of Crawford Drive secured her vehicle the evening of April 26, returned the next morning to find the contents of her glove-box strewn about and \$10 in change gone
- ⇒ One (1) case of theft in which a resident accidentally left his keys in the back-door lock and later found them gone

Part 2 offense reports

RCPD and MCPD recorded one (1) arrest for an outstanding bench warrant when responding to a domestic dispute, two (2) cases of simple assault with known suspects—one a case of domestic violence and the other an assault against an officer on-scene for public intoxication and public urination—and two (2) reports of vandalism.

Calls for Service Trends

Calls for service within TCA amounted to 55 calls in April, representing a typical volume when as this is the exact average call volume per (30 day) month.

Calls of disorder offenses (in this case, simple assault, disorderly conduct, public intoxication, vandalism, and juvenile offenses) and violent crime (both concerning aggravated assault) were both recorded at a significantly high volume. In the past few years, these call categories have averaged 15 calls per month and 1 call every two months, respectively.

Readers should note that calls described here may ultimately result in reports describing an incident outside the TCA boundaries, or outside this reporting period. Below one can find a table describing the disposition of calls by category:
