## Neighborhood Crime Breakdown, February 2022

Reporting Period: 01 January 2022 through 31 January 2022

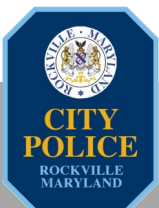
### Part 1 offense reports

In January 2021, Rockville City (RCPD) and Montgomery County police (MCPD) together recorded five (5) Part 1 offense reports within the boundaries of Twinbrook Community Association (TCA):

- ⇒ One (1) aggravated assault between two housemates during a dispute about air-conditioning
- ⇒ Three (3) theft-from-auto cases: first, a resident reported the loss of power-tools from his unlocked Ford truck overnight between January 01 and January 02. An additional two thefts were recorded in the 1600 block of Bradley Avenue, first in the early morning of January 12 when which suspects attempted to steal the catalytic converter of a Toyota Prius and again on January 23 when suspects targeted two locked vehicles and ultimately only stole \$2 in change.
- ⇒ One (1) package theft reported in the 1700 block of Crawford Drive during the afternoon of January 28, resulting in the loss of a bottle of over-the-counter pain medication.

### Part 2 offense reports

This past January, local police recorded eight (8) Part 2 offense reports within the boundaries of TCA, to include three (3) simple assault cases—two pertaining to a domestic dispute and a third alleged among acquaintances drinking on a bike path— and five (5) cases of vandalism, four concerning graffiti and one about damage found on the door of a parked car.

## Calls for Service Trends

Calls for service within TCA ticked down to 50 calls in January 2021, a figure still representing a subdued volume compared to TCA's historic average of 69 calls per (31 day) month. January's call count is at the bottom 6% of historic monthly TCA call volume.

All call categories were recorded near or well below their historic monthly average.

Readers should note that calls described here may ultimately result in reports describing an incident outside the TCA boundaries, or outside this reporting period. Below one can find a table describing the disposition of calls by category:
