Neighborhood Crime Breakdown, April 2022

Reporting Period: 01 March 2022 through 29 March 2022

Part 1 offense reports

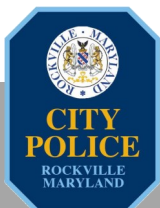
In March 2022 and within the boundaries of Twinbrook Community Association (TCA), Rockville City (RCPD) and Montgomery County police (MCPD) together recorded seven (7) reports of Part 1 offenses, to include:

- ⇒ Three (3) reports of catalytic converter theft:
 - ⇒ The first theft targeted an early-2000s sportscar sometime between March 13 to 16 in the 2300 block of Mcauliffe Drive. An additional two thefts within TCA targeted mid-2000s Toyota Prius vehicles overnight from March 24 to 25 in the 1900 blocks of Lewis Avenue and Valley Stream Drive.
- ⇒ Two (2) reports of theft-from auto:
 - ⇒ A resident in the 2000 block of MacDowell Street spotted three men inside his work-truck in the early morning of March 07, who fled in a black SUV. Three days later and again in the early morning, video from the 1900 block of Henry Road shows a subject, again with a black SUV, steal sunglasses and construction tools from inside two unlocked vehicles.
- ⇒ One (1) report of an attempted motor vehicle theft when a resident in the 700 block of Shetland Street found her Dodge Challenger's hood latch and ignition damaged overnight .
- ⇒ One (1) report of larceny from within a home and associated with a domestic dispute.

Part 2 offense reports

RCPD and MCPD recorded two (2) cases of simple domestic assault and one (1) case of DUI within TCA.

RCPD officers also recorded a series of two residential vandalism cases at the same address—once on the afternoon of March 04 and again on March 13— by a subject on foot acting for no clear reason, along with an additional and similar case over 1 mile away on March 22 at a home on Crawford Drive.

Calls for Service Trends

Calls for service within TCA stood at 53 calls in March 2022, representing a typical volume compared to TCA's historic average of 54 calls per (29 day) month. March's call count is at the top 46% of historic TCA call volume.

No category of call (listed below) was recorded at a significantly high volume.
