TWINBROOK COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION Neighborhood Crime Breakdown, March 2022

Reporting Period: 01 February 2022 through 28 February 2022

Part 1 offense reports

In February 2022 and within the boundaries of Twinbrook Community Association (TCA), Rockville City (RCPD) and Montgomery County police (MCPD) together recorded:

- ⇒ One (1) homicide, occurring the evening of February 17 in the 14000 block of Cove Lane and resulting in the subsequent arrest of two individuals.
- ⇒ Two (2) thefts-from-auto; first, a resident in the 5800 block of Aleutian Avenue left her car the afternoon of February 12 and returned the next morning to find loose change and her registration card stolen. About 1 week later in the 1900 block of Rockland Avenue another resident found that someone had also entered both her vehicle and that of her next-door neighbor.
- ⇒ One (1) theft of auto-parts when a resident in the 300 block of Cedar Lane reported that someone stole the catalytic converter of her Toyota Prius the morning of February 1st.
- ⇒ Two (2) motor vehicle thefts, first when a resident left his car with its keys inside during the afternoon of February 4th and found it missing the next day and, later, another Twinbrook resident accused her ex-boyfriend of unlawfully taking her vehicle.

Part 2 offense reports

RCPD recorded three (3) Part 2 offenses in February 2022, including one DUI and two cases of simple-assault between known parties.



Calls for Service Trends

Calls for service within TCA stood at 40 calls in February 2022, representing a subdued volume compared to TCA's historic average of 53 calls per (28 day) month. February's call count is at the bottom 16% of historic TCA call volume.

Only calls concerning burglary alarms were recorded at a unusually high volume, although all five calls occurred at separate locations and on separate days and no burglaries were ultimately recorded.

Readers should note that calls described here may ultimately result in reports describing an incident outside the TCA boundaries, or outside this reporting period. Below one can find a table describing the disposition of calls by category:
